The liturgies of Holy Week are the most important, solemn and inspiring ceremonies of the church year. In grateful remembrance, accompany our Lord through the week beginning on Palm Sunday. Join with the bishop and priests on Tuesday as their priestly commitment is reaffirmed and the sacred oils used in the sacraments are blessed by the bishop. Come to Mass on Spy Wednesday to hear the gospel account of Judas betraying our Lord. Accompany the apostles on Holy Thursday as they become the first priests and receive the Holy Eucharist for the first time. Follow our Lord into the Garden by spending time in adoration at the altar of repose. On Good Friday listen attentively to the reading of the passion before venerating the wood of the cross. Then on Holy Saturday wait with us in vigil in the night as we listen to the readings of the Old Testament recounting for us God's promise to save us. Then joyfully sing the word we haven't sung throughout Lent in celebration of our Lord's victory over death, the victory we will see first hand as two men are baptised, given new life in Christ. These events are the whole basis of our faith. Who will you invite from family and friends to join you at these ceremonies? Who needs to hear the good news that Jesus has conquered sin and death?

Good Friday is a day of fast and abstinence. All those 14 and older are required to abstain from eating meat on this day. Those 18-59 years of age are also required to fast, which means eating one full meatless meal and two smaller snacks to maintain strength if necessary. The law of fast and abstinence binds under pain of mortal sin.

Three plenary indulgences are available to the faithful during Holy Week, (under the usual conditions of confession, holy communion and prayers for the Holy Father's intentions) who:

- 1. on Holy Thursday, recite or sing *Tantun ergo* (e.g., when the Eucharist Is placed at the altar of repose);
 - 2. on Good Friday, participate in the solemn liturgical action and devoutly kiss the cross;
 - 3. on Holy Saturday, renew their baptismal promises at the Easter Vigil.

The annual Good Friday collection is the only yearly request asked by the Holy See of dioceses and parishioners throughout the world. The collection helps the Church of the Holy Land to maintain Christian sites, so important for Christians everywhere, and to provide pastoral, educational, and social works among the small Christian population. The Church and our Christian brothers and sisters count on your help to retain a faith filled Christian presence in this land of our Lord. Please give generously.
